The Love of God in the Light of Valentine's Day

We often think of Valentine's Day as the day for couples to show their love to one another, but rarely do we use the day to remind us of God's unmatched love for us, His children. For many single people, Valentine's Day can be a bitter reminder of their singleness and desire for a relationship. Luckily, God doesn't leave anyone, single or in a relationship, out of His unending love and grace.

In 1 John 4:8, the author says, "Whoever does not love does not know God, because God is love."

God is love itself. We wouldn't have any conception of "love" at all if it weren't for God, the definition of love.

God further defines love in the classic 1 Corinthians 13:4-8 passage that reads, "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails."

God describes love in this way, and then tells us that He is love. This further emphasizes that God himself is all of these things.

God is patient and kind. He keeps no record of wrongs. He always protects, always trusts, always hopes and always perseveres. God's love is a perfect love that no one on earth could ever emulate.

We often read this 1 Corinthians passage near Valentine's Day or at weddings to remind us what love should look like, but God is the perfect demonstration of it.

John 3:16 says, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life."

He gave up His only son for us. He gave us eternal life because of His great and unmatched love for each of us.

The theologian C.S. Lewis once said, "He died not for men, but for each man. If each man had been the only man made, He would have done no less."

God loves you so much. If you were the only one on earth He still would have sent His son for you.

So this Valentine's Day, remember to set your sights not on earthly relationships, but on the God above who loves far more fully and abundantly than we could ever imagine.

Four Signs of the End Times

It has been an exciting time as we have been studying through the book of Daniel the past several months. It is amazing to see how the prophecies in Daniel knock on the door of our own culture at the present time. Never before in history has our culture degenerated into the mires of immorality as it has in our present time. It is amazing to me that the vast majority of the world cannot see that Israel and Judah's rejection of God is repeating itself, starting at the top of our country's leaders. It is not hard to see that God has handed America over to the natural consequence of deserting Him. This is how the Apostle Paul saw things in his own day:

Since they thought it foolish to acknowledge God, He abandoned them to their foolish thinking and let them do things that should never be done. Their lives became full of every kind of wickedness, sin, greed, hate, envy, murder, quarreling, deception, malicious behavior, and gossip. They are backstabbers, haters of God, insolent, proud, and boastful. They invent new ways of sinning, and they disobey their parents. They refuse to understand, break their promises, are heartless, and have no mercy. They know God's justice requires that those who do these things deserve to die, yet they do them anyway. Worse yet, they encourage others to do them, too.

So God abandoned them to do whatever shameful things their hearts desired. (Romans 1: 28-32,24 (NLT)

That's a pretty harsh indictment from God. All of this is to bring attention to several things to consider in light of our prophetic studies. One of the foremost authorities on Bible prophecy is David Jeremiah. God has blessed him to bring clear truth from the Bible on future events. Dr. Jeremiah says this, "I can say with certainty that we are closer to the Rapture than ever before."

In His Olivet discourse, Jesus stated that no one—including Himself and the angels—knows when the Rapture will occur (Matthew 24:36). But prophetic events cast shadows, giving us a foreshadowing of what is to come. In anticipation of the end of the age, our Lord outlined several signs that would indicate His return was drawing near. These phenomena are increasingly evident in our world today. There are (4) signs that have significance that show how close we are to the amazing event of the Rapture.

SIGN #1 — The Sign of Deception

Deception may be one of the greatest threats to the Church today, but it is nothing new. Before the religious reforms of ancient Israel's King Josiah, the priests—God's representatives to the people—set up idols to false gods in the temple. And the people willingly participated in this idolatry. They didn't throw God out of their worship. Instead, they treated Him like He was one of many gods. The Israelites synthesized their religion with another. For all the deception going on today, we cannot spend our time chasing down every rumor. Our time is better spent focusing on the solution, and that is Jesus Christ. In John 14:6, He said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me."

SIGN #2 — Disputes Among the Nations

Jesus warned His disciples that the end of the age would be marked by "wars and rumors of wars" with nations rising against each other (Matthew 24: 6, 7). As dissension escalates, we can view it as a sign of the times. The book of Revelation tells us that conflict—ceaseless, unending, terrible war—will fill the Tribulation period, and it will escalate until the entire world is involved

Many countries live at peace today, but there is a growing sense of instability in international affairs. It has been reported that fifty percent of all research scientists are involved in arms development. There is at least one military weapon and four thousand pounds of explosives for every man, woman, and child on earth. As shocking as this may seem, long ago the Bible predicted an escalation of conflict, border skirmishes, race wars, and national battles during the End Times.

SIGN #3 — The Sign of Devastation

Along with the deception and disputes of the Last Days, Jesus warned of "famines, pestilences, and earthquakes in various places" (Matthew 24:7). We live in a day when we can scarcely turn on the TV without seeing someone trying to raise money to feed the hungry. Even though God has blessed us with a fruitful, abundant planet, millions of people in the world face food insecurity and scarcity. We are also witnessing an increase in the frequency and intensity of earthquakes. Between 1900 and 1969, there were roughly six major quakes every ten years. Recent data indicates that "major earthquakes" now occur more than once a month and "great earthquakes" shake the globe every year. All of these devastating trends are signs that point to the imminent return of Jesus Christ.

SIGN #4 — The Sign of Deliverance Into Tribulation

In the Last Days, there will be an explosion of antagonism toward God's people: "Then they will deliver you up to tribulation and kill you, and you will be hated by all nations for My name's sake" (Matthew 24:9). We are already seeing evidence of this today. Headlines carry stories about Christian business owners who are expected to set aside their beliefs in support of secular, progressive ideals. Universities and school boards admit to routinely passing over Christian faculty members for promotions. Everywhere we look, Christianity is under attack in America. As the Tribulation approaches, many more will pay a high price for living out their faith in our world.

Biblical prophecy reminds us that the deception, conflict, devastation, and tribulation of the Last Days is no match for Almighty God. When we experience terrible events like the COVID-19 pandemic and persecution, Scripture reminds us that God declares "the end from the beginning" and that His "counsel shall stand" (Isaiah 46:10). By understanding the signs of the end times in this context, we can join the Apostle Paul in saying, "For our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory" (2 Corinthians 4:17).

Unless the true Word is taught with life, The church will fall and end in strife. The schools, the church, the home, the heart, Everyone needs Jesus, that's where we start.


Heavenly Father, speak to us all; Save our cities, lest with them we fall. And if it's that time, please grant us peace, As the family fades and all order will cease.

Milestones

Food For Thought...

Frito Cheesy Chili Casserole

8 servings

Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 60 minutes 1/2

Ingredients

- 1½ pound ground beef
- 1 onion diced
- · 3 cloves garlic minced
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 1½ teaspoons onion powder
- 1½ teaspoons garlic powder
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- ¾ teaspoon ground cumin
- ½ teaspoon chipotle powder
- 6 tablespoons tomato paste
- 15 ounces tomato sauce
- ½ cup beef stock

For assembly:

- 9 cups lightly crushed Fritos
- 3 cups shredded cheddar cheese
- · sour cream for serving
- sliced scallions for serving



Instructions

- In a large skillet, brown and crumble the meat over medium-high with the onions.
- Break up the meat until there is no pink left and the onions appear translucent, stirring occasionally.
- Add the garlic and cook for 30 seconds until fragrant. Drain any excess fat.
- Add the chili powder, onion powder, garlic powder, salt, cumin, chipotle powder, and tomato paste. Cook for 2 minutes, stirring it all together until combined.
- Add the tomato sauce and beef stock, stir until combined.
- Bring to a simmer and cover, simmer for 20 minutes, stirring occasionally.
- Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- Add half of the crushed Fritos into the bottom of a greased 9x13 baking dish.
- Add half of the chili evenly over the Fritos, top with half of the cheese. Repeat with another layer.
- Cover with nonstick foil, or spray a piece of foil with cooking spray and place it spray side down on top of the baking dish.
- Bake for 20-30 minutes until warmed through and the cheese is melted.
- Uncover and bake for an additional 10 minutes.
- Serve immediately with a dollop of sour cream and sliced scallions. ENJOY!























FLOURLESS BANANA BROWNIES

Total Time: 30 minutes Yield: 16 (2-inch) brownies

Diet: Gluten Free

INGREDIENTS

- 5 ounces semi-sweet chocolate, chopped
- 2 large bananas, overripe (about 1 cup)
- ½ cup **tahini** (or other nut butter)
- 1 large egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- ½ cup granulated sugar
- ¼ cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 ounce **chocolate chips** (optional, for the top)

INSTRUCTIONS


- 1. Preheat oven to 350F. Spray an 8-inch square baking pan with cooking oil spray and line with parchment paper, allowing the paper to overhang off of the two sides for easy removal.
- 2. Melt the chocolate in a medium heatproof bowl over a pan of simmering water. Make sure the bottom of the bowl does not touch the water, or you will burn the chocolate. Whisk until melted and smooth. Remove from heat and let the chocolate cool down.
- 3. In a large mixing bowl, mash the bananas with a fork. Add tahini and use a hand mixer to beat together until incorporated.
- 4. Add egg, vanilla extract, and sugar, and beat on medium speed for 2 minutes. This will ensure that the brownies have a classic crinkly top.
- 5. Add in cocoa powder and melted chocolate and beat on low until incorporated, about 30 seconds.
- 6. Transfer batter into the lined baking pan and top with chocolate chips (optional).
- 7. Bake for 20-25 minutes for extra fudgy brownies (a toothpick inserted should still have some crumbs on it, and the middle should slightly jiggle), or bake for 25-30 minutes for brownies that are more set with a cakey texture (toothpick inserted won't have many crumbs on it with minimal to no jiggling in the middle).
- Allow the brownies to cool in the baking pan on a wire cooling rack. Once cooled, lift it out of the pan and cut into squares. Or enjoy it hot out of the pan with vanilla ice cream.




BAD NEWS SOLDIER, YOU'RE BEING TRANSFERRED TO A MASH UNIT.





Answer: Silversmith

Ephesus was the home of the Temple of Artemis, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. Demetrius' trade was dependent on the worship of Artemis as he crafted silver shrines to her. The Christian church taught people to follow only one God and therefore threatened his job. Working with other tradesmen, he created a riot with Artemis as their rallying cry. Afterwards, Paul continued on to Macedonia.
